### **Management Recommendations**

**Planting**Plant at moderate populations for your area and let the ear flex go to work for you. Emergence and early vigor is good, but plant your other hybrids before Charo. We've seen Charo move South into fuller season maturity

zones and do extremely well.

**Early Season** Seedling vigor is good. The plant grows fast once established. While not needed, Charo responds well to high-

management farming and spoon-feeding nutrients.

Mid-Season Leaf disease tolerance is pretty good, with most things being rated good to very good. Although generally not

needed, it has shown a favorable response to fungicide application.

**Late Season** Very good stalk and root ratings, with decent plant health. Does have dual utility for silage use.

**Harvest** Girthy, flex ear with excellent kernel depth. Very good stalk and root ratings.
